What is military reserve pay?

Military reserve pay is available for reserve officers and enlisted soldiers. While you're serving your weekends and other training duties, you'll receive pay based on the number of drills you complete. Pay is typically issued on the first and 15th of each month.

Do National Guard and reserve members get paid?

Pay for National Guard and Reserve members depends on rank, job, and time in service. Members are paid for all training, including weekend drills and annual training, and receive different types of military pay based on their service status. Do National Guard and Reserve members receive Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH)?

What is military reserve drill pay?

Reserve pay is one of the many benefits of being in the military reserves. If you're a National Guard or a Reserve Soldier who's performing drilling and other training duties, you can receive compensation in the form of military reserve drill pay.

Do reserve members get regular drill pay?

In return reserve members receive regular drill pay and other benefits. If you are serving as a member of the Selected Reserve, you are eligible for regular drill pay, and might qualify for some special pays. Each "Drill Weekend" counts as 4 Drill Periods for pay purposes. Check out the Drill Pay Charts to see how much you could earn each month.

How much does a reservist make a month?

Monthly earnings vary based on rank, years of service, and participation in drill periods. Base pay rates for reservists depend on rank and years of service. For example, an E-1 with less than two years of service earns \$231.00 per weekend drill, while an O-1 with less than two years of service makes \$401.36 per weekend drill.

Do reservists get paid?

Like the active duty troops, Reservists also get basic pay, allowances where appropriate, and special pay where appropriate. But this pay is offered only for the periods of service the Reservists show up for including training, drill weekends, and active duty service when activated.
